

### From the Co-op Buying Animals on the Internet

It is said a picture is worth a thousand words. But in the case of buying animals over the internet I beg to differ. I say only (2) two...... BUYERS BEWARE! The sad part is if you're reading this, you are more than likely educated well enough to already know better. Hopefully by me writing, maybe it will fall into the hands of a newcomer or youth and help them not encounter what many have already.

Photos can be so deceiving from both sides of the spectrum. I personally can't take a photo of a BIS rabbit with a \$4,500 Nikon Camera and make it presentable. But I have seen photos taken of rabbits with an iPhone

that look like the photographer for Sports Illustrated took them. To many times newcomers are sucked into phrases like "Show Quality" and how many legs the parents or grandparents have. I saved some photos some time back of a rabbit a breeder was selling as "Show Quality" that was F3 or 75% of the actual breed, and in the same panorama photo, F4 baby at (3) three weeks "will be show quality."

Then there is the "Bait and Switch". Where someone has taken photos of quality animals or even stolen photos of other animals off of the internet, sent these photos to a perspective buyer and then sent a different animal in its place. Sending you a photo doesn't mean they have that rabbit. It's possible it's just a picture of that rabbit.

I know if you live in South Alabama like me, you're more than likely not going to fly to California or Connecticut just to pick up a rabbit, it is just cost prohibitive. There are a lot of things that you can do to circumvent what may be a huge disappointment if you decide purchase an animal sight unseen.

- Know the breeder. By this I mean do your homework...research. Talk to people that have purchased from the breeder, if need be ask for references. Is the breeder true to their word?
- If at all possible, put your hands on the rabbit to make sure this is the animal you thought you were getting from the photo. Remember it is impossible to ascertain how a rabbit feels, and its conditioning from a photo. If possible, have the breeder hold the rabbit if there is an upcoming show you both will be attending. Check ear number and have the pedigree in hand before you leave.

- If the rabbit has to be transported, know your transporter. Have them send photos, check for obvious faults and poor conditioning and use due diligence, not just pick up your rabbit. At this point they are the only thing keeping you from making a bad purchase, if they're not willing to do this, find someone else.
- If the rabbit has to be flown in, is that really a viable option at the time or should you seek new time frame to purchase the rabbit. Airline transport can be quite expensive and coordinating optimal shipping conditions can be difficult at times depending on the point of origin to the point of destination.
- Don't make a knee jerk purchase. A lot of times around convention and nationals the internet is flooded with photos of amazing rabbits. In my opinion, you should have talked to a breeder long before the photos are being posted and a hasty decision has to be made. While many people go to Convention or Nationals to purchase rabbits, be mindful that many breeders have already presold their top stock prior to the show. In general, if you want to see the difference in presold rabbits versus rabbits for sale at Convention and Nationals, just volunteer to be a runner.....you will be amazed.
  - Know that the cost of a rabbit does not make it a better rabbit. I have seen rabbits sold for \$250 by one breeder,

- only to be resold by another breeder a year later for \$450. Just like the quality in the photo is not always indicative of the quality of the animal being presented.
- IMO if done right, buying off the internet is not a bad thing, but go into the buying process with an open mind when buying sight unseen. Faults can be hidden easily in photos or worse yet, rabbits can be swapped....so BUYERS BEWARE.
