HELP HINTS:

Show Sites

I am writing this article to give everyone some general tips on securing a show site. I will concentrate on the state show, but this can be adapted to any show. You will just need to keep in mind if it is the youth show, a specialty or a double show. I hope this will give everyone the information to check on places in your area and allow us to move the state show around more.

The first thing I look at is size. I am not one to understand square footage so I tend to compare to a site I know. I have learned a bit more about the square footage the last few weeks. I think we need at least 5,000 square feet for the state show. We have had some places with less and they have worked but can be tight. The next thing is to contact the facility. Make sure they allow animals. If they are not familiar with the shows, I explain the basics to them. They need to understand that though we use leak proof pans that this is not perfect. We will have spills and fur everywhere. If this is acceptable to them, get a bid. You want to have all the details included.

Who cleans, can we set up the night before, can we sell concessions, raffle table, etc. You want as much information as possible. You will also need to be sure they will hold the date until we vote at the meeting. You also want to get a contact person and phone number. Some places require liability insurance. The club has insurance so this is not an issue. This bid is then submitted at the state meeting 2 years in advance.

I have heard people say that if you secure the site, you have to be the show superintendent or secretary. This is not true. You can volunteer for one of the positions but it is not necessary. I would suggest that you offer to be the contact person with the facility personnel since you will be familiar with the site. If this is not possible, that can be worked out too. It is just easier for the person close to the facility to get the keys and take them back.

These suggestions need to be followed so that when the site is chosen, we can finalize the venue and hire judges. Judges can be hard to get at this time of year.

Even if all this happens, issues still arise so don't get discouraged. It just needs to be handled as soon as possible after the state meeting. The biggest thing to remember is to ask for help if needed.

The History of the Netherland

Dwarf by Emily Stidd, Silver Star

Rabbitry

Netherland Dwarfs began in the 1880's in England when Ruby Eyed White mismarks were found in Dutch litters. These were interbred and the offspring were called Polish. They were first exhibited in England in 1884. Soon afterwords they were exported to Germany, where they gained popularity. There, they were crossed with wild rabbits, which resulted in small Agouti colored dwarfs.

In the 1930's the only colors available were the Ruby Eyed Whites and the Blue Eyed Whites. Jan Meyering, who raised Dutch took up some of the Ruby Eyed Whites and crossed them with other breeds to introduce different colors. After years of hard work they were given a standard in 1940.

Netherland Dwarfs were imported to the United States in 1965 and were bred manly to improve the Polish breed. In 1969 Darrel Bramhall, a rabbit breeder from Iowa, met Jack Turnbull, a Netherland Dwarf

breeder from England. While discussing the breed, Jack Turnbull mentioned that he had plans to import Netherland Dwarfs from England that year. Darrel Bramhall did not hear from Jack Turnbull again until June of that year, when he wrote to him, asking how the importation was coming. Jack Turnbull wrote back stating that he had imported several dwarfs and asked if Darrel Bramhall wanted a few of them. Darrel Bramhall bought several pairs. The first Pair that he received was Himalayan marked. Darrel Bramhall suggested that they form a Netherland Dwarf specialty club. He also started working on the standard to present to the ARBA, in the hopes that they would accept them as a new breed.

Jack Turnbull exhibited the first
Netherland Dwarfs at the ARBA
convention. He brought a pair of
Ruby Eyed Whites, one Black and
one Siamese Sable. All together
there were 6 dwarfs shown, the four
from Jack Turnbull and a pair of
Ruby Eyed Whites from Albert
Reurs. At the show the ARBA
accepted the Netherland Dwarf as a
new breed.

The first National Netherland Dwarf show was held in Montpelier Ohio. There were 85 Netherland Dwarfs shown by 26 exhibitors, all of which were judged by Darrel Bramhall.

Today the Netherland Dwarf (nicknamed Gem of the Fancy by the ARBA) is a very popular show and pet breed, both for its small size and large assortment of recognized colors.

If Youth participate in the youth show then double points shall be awarded, if extenuating circumstances arise that a youth cannot attend the required State show, then he/she shall turn written proof of absence over to the Executive Board of the LRBA, Inc. postmarked within thirty (30) days of the show. The Executive Board has sixty (60) days after the show to approve/disapprove any excuses received and notify the member and sweepstakes chairperson of eligibility for the sweepstakes.

Proposal #5

Article X Sweepstakes

Section 1

Currently reads: LRBA Inc sweepstakes and quality points year

will run from Annual State Meeting to Annual State Meeting.

Proposed change: The LRBA Inc sweepstakes and quality points year will run from January 1st to December 31st.

Reason: Due to most national clubs running the points Jan-Dec, it makes sense for us to run the same way. It would also give more time to prepare awards from the last show of the season to the state meeting.

Proposal #6

Section 4 C

Currently reads: "...No more than (2) members or rabbitries shall be combined."

Proposed change: No more than (2) members or rabbitries from separate households shall be combined, i.e. Siblings may combine regardless of number in family.

Siblings should be able to show together no matter how many in the family. They all generally work out of the same barn.

Proposal #7

Proposed addition: Considering point schedule, I would like to see bonus points added for BIS (20 Sweeps 5 quality), RIS (15 sweeps 3 quality), 2RIS (10 sweeps 2 quality), and BOBO (5 sweeps 1 quality)

Section 6.

LRBA Inc. members will be credited with sweepstakes points as follows:

1st place in class gets 6 times the total number of rabbits in the class

2nd place gets 4 times the class number

3rd place gets 3 times the class number

4th place gets 2 times the class number

5th place gets 1 time the class number

Plus a bonus for each BEST OF BREED (1 times the number of rabbits in the breed); BEST OPPOSITE SEX OF BREED (½ times the number of rabbits in the breed); Best in Show (20 points); 1st Reserve in Show (15 points); 2nd Reserve in Show (10 points); Best of Best Opposites (5 points). Points are to be computed on the actual number of rabbits judged. Double points awarded for the Annual State Show and Youth Scholarship Show.

Section 6a.

LRBA, Inc. members will be credited with quality points as follows:

BOB – 1 point for each rabbit exhibited in the breed

BOS – ½ point for each rabbit exhibited in the breed

Plus a bonus for each Best in Show (5 points); 1st Reserve in Show (3 points); 2nd Reserve in Show (2 points); Best of Best Opposites (1 point). Quality points listings will show the following: the number of BOB's and BOS's of breeds won by the exhibitor; quality points for each breed by the exhibitor; total overall quality points per exhibitor.

Reason: I would like to see some recognition for those who hit the higher marks at shows. It is an honor to receive BIS, RIS 2RIS, or BOBO and those who do, should have some modest point recognition.

Awards Criteria

Proposed change:" ...for less than two (2) years at time of nominations."

Change: The LRBA, Inc. will furnish awards for Best in Show, 1st Runner-Up to Best in Show, 2nd Runner up to Best in Show, Best Opposite Sex in Show. Best of Breed and Best Opposite Sex of Breed will furnished by LRBA, Inc. and be awarded for Alaso ARBA, Inc. recognized breeds.

Reason: Wording change, brought up during review of CBL after State Meeting.

Change: The LRBA, Inc. sweepstakes and quality points year will run January 1 through December 31 of each year. Reason: Sweepstakes is a tight deadline between Memorial Day Show and the Annual State Meeting. Article II Section 1 states that the State meeting can be held on any weekend in June, almost making it unobtainable if the meeting is held early June. This would give the sweepstakes chairman time to get certificates and awards together to present at the State Show.


