This is somewhat of a breakdown.

Rules:

- 1) Must be a valid ARBA and LRBA member.
- 2) Must be a member of a local club inside the state.
- 3) Must reside in the State.
- 4) Must write an Essay, less than 2,000 words.
- 5) Enclose a photo of yourself with the application.

Application:

The application must consist of the essay and a form (which we could hand out a show or meeting etc.) The form would include your full name, age, and address. The applications must also

consist of a photo no larger than 3X3, preferably a photo of you as the center, but animals are allowed.

Categories:

There are 8 categories, which then are divided by gender.

King- Male(15-18)
Queen- Female(15-18)
Duke-Male((12-14)
Duchess-Female(12-14
Prince- Male (9-11)
Princess- Female(9-11)
Lord-Male(5-8)
Lady-Female (5-8)

Scoring Components:

This will be a 500 point Competition. Written Examination - 200 points

Oral Interview-100 points

Breed Identification-100 points

Age appropriate Contest-100 points.


FROM THE CLRBA:

Minutes from the

LRBA Annual State Meeting

June 30, 2012

The meeting was called to order by President Kevin LeBlanc at 8:20am. Roll call was done by sign in sheet. We had 21 adult members in attendance. Ariana St. Pierre motioned to accept 2011 minutes as published. Motion was 2nd and passed. Amy Lukaszeski read the treasurer's report by giving account balances. Full disclosure was printed for everyone and attached to the agenda. Audit committee- Shelia Humphries, Bryan Manning, and Breanna Dunaway found no errors or discrepancies. Ariana St. Pierre read the secretary's report, stating that we have as of the opening of the meeting, 10 affiliated clubs, 344 members (51 members increased over last year). Of the 344 total members, 149 are youth members and 195 are adult members. Lynn Hebert read over the eBoard report.

An election of officers was held.

Nominees for president were Ronnie

Duhon and Lynn Hebert. Lynn was
elected by a vote of 12-3. Breanna

Dunaway and Ronnie Duhon were
nominated for Vice President. Breanna
was elected by a vote of 11-2. Ariana St
Pierre was nominated for secretary and

there was no opposition. Amy Lukaszeski was nominated for treasurer and there was again no opposition. Breanna Dunaway accepted the position of Youth Advisory Committee Chairperson.

The 2013 State Show was discussed. The date chosen is March 2, 2013 to be held in Lake Charles at the Burton Center. Allen Wainwright will be superintendent and Ariana St. Pierre will be secretary. The area 4H club will volunteer to handle the raffle and concession. Stacy Hyatt and Angelle Kraemer will be the awards committee and will be working with the set budget of \$1,500.00. The judges' budget was set at \$2,500.00. The following specialty clubs have requested and were granted permission to hold specialty shows at the 2013 state show: Polish, Netherland Dwarf, Dutch, and Mini Rex. The following judges were suggested to be bid on for this show: Sara Michaud, Cheryl Blackman, Lee Engel, Lance Gendron, Wade Burkhalter, Briony Barnes, Michael Franke, Theresa Schwandt, Rusty Westhoff, Josh Humphries, and Gail Krall.

Volunteer positions were discussed. Allen Wainwright volunteered to take over the sweepstakes contest. Karen Guillory was reappointed as the newsletter editor as well as Collette Waters reappointed to webspinner. A new volunteer position has emerged—Historian. Lisa Wainwright has agreed to take on this task with help along the way from Kelley Trahan. Stacy Hyatt was appointed as equipment manager and is now in charge of the LRBA trailer and its contents.

Ariana St. Pierre made a motion to end the LRBA's affiliation with Southern University rabbit show. The motion was seconded and 9 voted to end the affiliation and 2 voted to keep. We will no longer host the Southern University rabbit show.

Bradley Babin will be secretary and Ariana St Pierre will be superintendent of the 2012 Youth Show to be held in Lake Charles at the Burton facility. Judges will be Cheryl Blackman and Lee Engel.

Ariana St Pierre will be superintendent for the 2013 Memorial Weekend show to be held at the Exhibition Center next to the Coliseum in Alexandria. Breanna Dunaway will be youth show secretary and Collette Waters will be open show secretary. South Louisiana Netherland Dwarf club will host the concession stand with profits to be split 50/50 with LRBA. Stacy Hyatt and Angelle Kraemer are in charge of awards with a budget of \$3.000.00. Judges' budget was set at \$8,000.00 to hire 12 judges. The North Louisiana Rabbit Club will host the raffle table.

Blair Guerin will be the superintendent for the 2013 Youth Show to be held in Plaquemine, La. and Breanna Dunaway will be the show secretary. The show will be held November 9, 2013.

The 2014 State Show will be held on March 1, 2014 at the Ruston Ag Expo Center. Mary Beth Bearden and Michael Ellerbe will co-superintendent the show with Breanna Dunaway being show secretary. Judges budget was set at \$3,000.00 with the following judges suggested: Glenn Carr, Don

Mersiovsky, Tony Bell, Tom Green, Lee Engel, Lance Gendron, Scott Rodriguez, Allen Mesick, Michael Franke, and Wade Burkhalter. The awards budget was set at \$1,800.00 and will also include sweepstakes awards.

Kevin LeBlanc proposed to create a committee that would be responsible for looking into and pricing building new tables for LRBA. Allen Wainwright and Bryan Manning are heading this committee and will report their findings at the 2013 State Meeting.

Acquiring a bank card for the LRBA checking account to aid in booking flights and hotels was discussed and the majority decided to correct the officers on the account within 30 days and use a prepaid type card for booking.

The motion to adjourn was unanimous.
