YOUTH BREEDER OF THE YEAR

ALYSSA LLOID:

Thank you for the honor of being nominated for Youth Breeder of the Year!

I'm Alyssa Lloid. I'm a freshman at Pineville High School. I live just outside the city limits of Pineville, Louisiana with my mom, dad, and many, many pets! I have one dog, four fish, a turtle, nine cats, and about eighty rabbits. I play the bassoon in the Pineville High Rebel Band and I'm on Flag Line. I'm in Key Club and Girl Scouts. I have been in 4-

H since 4th grade. In 4th grade I only had a few rabbits and went to only one show. The next year I went to two 4-H shows and one Louisiana Rabbit Breeders Association (LRBA) show. I learned a lot and got more rabbits and started entering more LRBA rabbit shows. Now I have about eighty rabbits.

I raise and show Dutch, Mini Lops, Satins, Netherland Dwarfs and Californians. I also show one Jersey Wooly and one New Zealand (Calypso is BIG). The smaller rabbits are a lot easier to carry around!

I belong to the American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA), Louisiana Rabbit Breeders Association, Central Louisiana Rabbit Breeders Association. 

OPEN ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

ARIANA ST. PIERRE

I would first like to say that it is an honor to be nominated for open rookie of the year. Our family hobby has come such a long way in a short time and it wouldn't have happened without the help and advice of other breeders. The children and I got started the summer before my oldest son entered 4th grade and 4-H. My mother in law insisted we needed rabbits because my husband had such fun with them when he was in 4-H. So we searched out a local breeder and purchased 5 rabbits. Four of the first 5 didn't survive the first year. It took months of research and lots of purchasing and selling before we really knew which breeds were right for us. Our daughter, April added Holland Lops, American Fuzzy Lops, Jersey Woolies, Netherland Dwarfs, French Lops, and English Lops to our herd. April raised rabbits for 8 years, until she graduated from high school and got a job with work hours that kept her away from the rabbit shows.

After our youngest graduated from high school and her job kept her away from the show table and away from the rabbits, my wife and I decided to get rid of all the rabbits. We had sold all the rabbits, with the exception of a few Holland Lop rabbits. We went to the Southern University Annual Rabbit Show with the intention of trying to sell the rest of them. Judy Duthu had a few young Dutch bunnies for sale and Yvonne begged me to buy her two of them. So much for getting out of raising rabbits!
